


Coverage of Race in the Dakotas

The issue of race is all around us. Shootings in mosques in New Zealand. Police shootings of blacks. An attack on a synagogue in Pittsburgh. In the Dakotas, the primary minority group is native people. How do newspapers and other media do at covering native communities and issues? The question forms the basis of a panel discussion featuring Tim Giago, editor of Native Sun News Today in Rapid City; Scott Davis, N.D. Commissioner of Indian Affairs; Jodi Rave Spotted Bear, Founder/Director of Indigenous Media Freedom Alliance; and Dave Flute, SD Secretary of Tribal Affairs. The panel will be moderated by a seasoned journalist.

Members or subscribers?

Cecile Wehrman and Aaron Becher offer a program that looks at the legacy "subscriber" model of newspaper readership and the trending "member" model.

Wehrman is president of Journal Publishing Inc., which publishes newspapers in Crosby and Tioga, ND. She is a past president of NDNA and currently serves as second vice president of the NDNA board.

Becher is vice president for newspapers of Forum Communications Co., and formerly was advertising director and then general manager of The Forum of Fargo-Moorhead. He currently serves as president of the NDNA Education Foundation.

From Print to Podcasts

Journalist and educator Teri Finneman says newspapers can use podcasts to expand their reach, and she'll show you how.

Finneman started her journalism career as an intern at her home town Hazen Star, then eventually became multimedia correspondent for Forum Communications. After receiving her master's degree and Ph.D. from the Missouri School of Journalism, she went to work for South Dakota State University as an assistant professor of journalism, and now teaches at the University of Kansas.
